

Malvern Hills Site of Special Scientific Interest -Supplementary mapping

The Malvern Hills were designated as a <u>Site of Special Scientific Interest</u> (SSSI) in 1954. This designation identifies and protects certain wildlife and geological features as features of national importance.

This mapping is supplemental to the <u>SSSI citation document</u>. It provides direction as to how the site's habitats should be managed over the next 20 years to help deliver favourable condition of the SSSI and support defined landscape character of the <u>Malvern Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty</u> (AONB).

Work to achieve this visionary map will involve the maintenance of grasslands, the restoration of open habitats, and the expansion of woodlands.

Four broad habitat types are used and displayed on the following five maps. These are: Open acid grassland (cream), Grass mosaic (pink), Wood mosaic (brown) and Woodland (green).
